Chains

which is a lava, 18 x 12 x 10 ins., loosely set in a mound of stone, marked 5 notches and SC on N. face, and 6 notches on W. edge.

I change this cor. to a witness point by marking the corner monument WP on N. face.

Land, broken, with a general northeasterly exposure and drainage.

Soil, shallow, loose, sand loam; 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, dense, short sagebrush.

No timber.

Fair grazing.

North, on retracement line along the E. bdy. sec. 1.

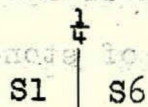
50.72 Fall 2 lks. W. of the closing cor. of the NE. cor.

T. 40 N., R. 21 E., heretofore described.

The course of this line therefore is, N. 0° 01' E., and the distance is 50.72 chs.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. secs. 1 and 6, which is an iron post, 1 1/2 in. diam., extending 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap marked:
