


## WEST BOUNDARY OF T. 24 N., R. 67 E.

in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap  
marked

45.00 Spur, projects W.; continue over rolling land.

54.90 Draw, course W.

65.00 Low spur, projects W.

described.

Land, rolling hilly land at the foot of mountains;  
general drainage W.

Soil, sandy clay loam, limestone formation; 3rd rate.

Timber, a few scattered juniper.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush and native grasses.

Fair grazing.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy.  
of T.24 N., R.67 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins.  
in diam., 24 ins. above the ground and in a mound of  
stone, properly marked and witnessed as described in  
the official record of T. 23 N., R. 67 E.

N.  $0^{\circ} 01'$  W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over rough and broken mountain land, thru medium timber  
and undergrowth. Asc. 220 ft. over broken W. slope.

23.00 Spur divide, projects SE.; desc. 40 ft. over broken N.  
slope.

35.00 Draw, course SE.; asc. 140 ft. over SE. slope to
