Chains

Undergrowth, sagebrush and native grasses.

Good grazing.

N. 0° 20' E., on a true line, bet. secs. 4 and 5.

Over high, broken mountain land, thru medium undergrowth.

Asc. 50 ft. over W. and SW. slope.

10.00 Spur ridge, projects W. from E.; desc. 221 ft. over NW. slope.

22.70 Small draw. course W.; continue desc. 115 ft. over broken NW. slope.

35.00 Enter scattered timber, bears E. and W.

39.00 Leave timber, bears E. and W.

40.00 On broken NW. slope

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

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and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of the post.

63.25 Divide ridge, between Antelope and Spring Valley, bears NW. and SE.; continue desc. 380 ft. over N. slope.

79.82 On N. slope, near head of draw course N.

Intersect N. bdy. of the township, 114 lks., W. of the cor. of secs. 32 and 33, T. 25 N., R. 67 E.; heretofore described, and at point of intersection

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5, with brass cap marked
