GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is approximately six thousand (6000) feet above sea level, and lies on a low saddle divide that connects the Kerns Mountains to the north with the Snake Range to the south. This low divide runs in a northerly direction thru the west center of the township, and makes a drainage to the east into Snake Valley, and west into Spring Valley.

The general surface character of the land in the township is described as follows: The north-east quarter of the township consists of rolling land, that is drained to the south east by large washes and draw, that have distinct rims, that range from ten (10) feet to fifty (50) feet in height. This portion of the township is covered with a scattered to medium dense growth of pinon pine and juniper timber: The south-east quarter of the township consists of rolling land with a drainage to the north-east and east. Very little timber will be found on this portion of the township: The western half of the township consists of rolling hilly land, draining to the west and is covered with a scattered growth of pinon pine and juniper timber. In this portion of the township will be found a low range of hills, but higher than the remainder of the township, bearing in a northerly and southerly direction, thru the township.
