Chains	A pinon pine, 12 ins in diam., bears S. 43° W., 56 lks. dist., marked T 20½ N R 69 E S 36 CC BT. Land, rough and broken hilly land at the foot of steep rugged mountain land; general drainage SW. Soil, rocky, sandy, gravelly clay loam; 3rd and 4th rate. Timber, pinon pine and juniper, with scattered mahogany. Undergrowth, sagebrush, shadscale and native grasses.
