And raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high,

Land, high, rolling mountainous; general easterly
exposure and drainage on S. $73\frac{1}{2}$ chs., and to NW. on
N. $6\frac{1}{2}$ chs.

Soil, light, shallow sandy clay mountain loam, mixed
with rock of limestone formation and coarse gravel;
much loose rock on surface; 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, medium sagebrush, buckbrush and grass.

Timber, very scattered scrub cedar and pinon.

East, on random line bet. secs. 25 and 36.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.

80.00 Intersect E. bdy. of tp., 2 lks. N. of the cor. of
secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is an iron post, 2
ins. dia., firmly set in ground and surrounded by a
mound of stone, properly marked and witnessed as
described in the survey of T. 25 N., R. 66 E.

Thence

N. $89^{\circ}59'$ W., on true line bet. secs. 25 and 36.

Over high, rolling mountainous land, through medium
undergrowth and scattered timber; ascend steep E. slope.

5.70 Line crosses N. end of rock outcrop, 10 ft. high,
extends S.

8.85 Top of S. point of high, rocky point of spur, bears
N. 5° W. for about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to peak, and breaks off to
S. and SE., 185 ft. above cor.; desc. steep, rocky
