

Mineral Segregation Survey in Sec. 31, T. 20 N., R. 19 E.

Chains

SURVEY OF THE FERNDALE LODGE

At the original location monument for the NW. cor. of the "Ferndale" lode, identical with the SW. cor. of the "Ferndale Fraction" and the SW. cor. of the Martha Washington" lodes, which is a surfaced post, 4 ins. square, firmly set in a mound of stone and distinctly scribed on three faces.

Set on NE. slope on S. side of small drain, draining S. 60°E. in scattering sage brush an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground in mound of stone for cor. Nos. 5, 4 and 2 Martha Washington, Ferndale Fraction and Ferndale lodes respectively, with brass cap mkd.



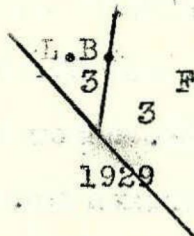

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, N. of cor. Thence S. 13° 24' E.

Descend along gentle rolling and broken SE. slopes through dense undergrowth

- 9.88 Intersect the SW. location corner of the "Ferndale" lode, identical with Cor. No. 3 Sur. No. 3624, "Luckey Boy" lode which is a 4x4 in. post, distinctly scribed, and securely supported in a mound of earth and stone.

Set on E. slope in fairly thick sagebrush an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in ground in mound of stone, over broken glass deposit, for cor. Nos. 3-3 Ferndale and Sur. No. 3624 Luckey Boy lodes, with brass cap marked

Thence S. 61° 07' E.

Descend along broken and rolling SE. slopes.

- 17.70 Enter shallow bottom of wide draw, 150 ft. below cor.,
