

Retracement of the State Boundary line between Mile Posts 155 and 157 along the West Boundary of Secs. 30 and 31, T. 22 N., R. 18 E.

Chains The point for the original 155 Mile Posts is identified by a burned fragment of an old surfaced pine post upon one face of which unmistakable scribe marks are visible, lying on an old scattered mound of earth in the center of which the rotted stub of the old post was found. In center of mound, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 30 ins. in the ground over a broken glass memorial, for restored 155 Mile Post corner, with brass cap marked

No suitable bearing trees or other accessories available.  
Build small mound of stones around post.

Thence  
S. 0° 02'W., on true course, the flag at the 156 Mile Post being visible,

68.59 A point N.88°35'W., 42 lks. from the old closing cor. of Secs. 30 and 31 on a line projected from the Cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Establish corner at this point as hereinafter described.

72.59 Intersect a point 37 lks. west of the closing corner of Secs. 30 and 31, T. 22 N., R. 18 E., M.D.M. California, which is a granite stone, 8x10x22 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. 5 notches N. and 1 South and a faint CC on W. face. Mound of stone West.

79.84 Intersect the point of the 156 Mile Post corner marked by a hub driven firmly in the ground in the center of an old mound of earth and stone. The original corner post, a surfaced 4x4 in. post about three feet long and plainly scribed was lying on top of mound.

At exact hub point, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground over broken glass memorial for restored 156 Mile Post corner, with brass cap mkd
