The bearing of this mile, therefore is N. $89^{\circ} 43'$ W., and
the dist. 80.90 chs.

West, along S. bdy. sec. 31.

40.00 Find no trace of original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

70.26 Find no trace of the original Tp. cor., and set temp.
point for the cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 N., Rs. 52 and 53
E.

West on same line bet. secs. 1 and 36, with continuous
measurement

110.26 Find no trace of original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

164.38 Fall 12.18 chs. S. of the original cor. of secs. 1, 2,
35, and 36, hereinafter described.

The proportionate departure for these two miles therefore
is 76.85 chs. for the S. bdy. sec. 31, and 87.52 chs.
for the line bet. secs. 1 and 36.
