

Survey of the subdivisions of fractional T. 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 24 E.

Chains.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. Bdy. of the township, which is an iron post, 2 ins. in diam., firmly set and properly marked and witnessed, as described in the field notes of T. 45 N., R. 24 E.

N. 0° 01' W. bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Desc. 60 ft. over slightly rolling mesa:

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

Raise a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of the cor.

52.90 Top of mesa rim 10 ft. high, bears NE. and SW.

Desc. along broken and rocky NE. slope 250 ft.

74.72 Intersect the Ninth Standard Parallel North, at a point, west on line, 11.73 chs. distant from the Standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 34, which is a basalt stone, firmly set and properly marked and witnessed, as described in the field notes of T. 46 N., R. 24 E. At the point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the closing corner of secs. 35 and 36, with brass cap mkd.

Raise a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of the cor.

Land: S. 53.00 chs. slightly rolling mesa; N. 27.00 chs. broken and rocky slope of mesa.

Soil: heavy clay, rocky and gravelly and generally thickly strewn with surface rock of volcanic origin.

Undergrowth: sage. Fair growth of grass.
