The area embraced in the survey of this fractional township is almost wholly suited for grazing purposes.

The table land in sections 35 and 36 is slightly rolling and very rocky, descending rather abruptly westward to Echo Canyon, which is generally broken through section 34 and gradually ascending to rolling mountainous land to the west of the canyon.
