

Subdivision of T. 32 N., R. 59 E.

Chains

A limber pine, 18 ins.diam., bears N.66°E., 67 lks.
dist., marked WC $\frac{1}{4}$ S29 BT

A limber pine, 12 ins.diam., bears S.76 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 33 lks.
dist., marked WC $\frac{1}{4}$ S32 BT

Witness cor. situated on steep N. slope among outcrops,
about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ chs. N. of top of spur and 5 chs. S. of
canyon bottom, and 1350 ft. above sec. cor.

Thence by chaining.

Asc. 220 ft. over abrupt N. and NE. slopes to

47.41 Point "A" of triangulation; top of high, rocky spur,
projects S.80°E.; thence along S. slope, near top,
over high, broken granite outcrops.

52.00 Top of granite outcrops, 100 ft. high, bears N.1 ch.
to spur and breaks off to S.

57.00 Depression on S. slope, drains S.; asc. steep, rocky
S. slope, 520 ft. to cor.

80.04 The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, 900 ft. above the
witness $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

Land; rough mountainous land with general easterly
exposure and drainage.

Soil; rocky of granite formation in form of outcrops,
bedrock and boulders, with shallow gravelly loam:
4th rate.

Timber; scattered limber pine and mahogany, with aspen
on E. end of mile.

Undergrowth; manzanita, choke-cherry, service and
sagebrush.

Fair to poor grazing land.

West on a random line bet. secs. 30 and 31.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

111.55 Intersect W. bdy. of tp., 3 lks. N. of the cor. of secs.
30 and 31, a 2 in. iron post, established by me under
this group and described in notes of T. 32 N., R. 58 E.

Thence
