

SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T. 32 N., R. 58 E.

Chains

- 47.50 Leave streams and swampy ground, bears NW. and SE.;
begin steep descent over SE. slope of mountain.
- 58.50 Slope changes from SE. to nearly E. slope, bears NE.
and SW.
- 77.00 Base of mountain slope, enter Lamaille Canyon, bears
N.30°E. and SW.
- 77.65 Forest Service trail, bears NE. and SW.
- 79.65 The cor. of T. 32 N., Rs. 58 and 59 E., heretofore
described, 1125 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- Land, rough mountainous, with general S. and SE. exposure
and drainage into Lamaille Canyon, except on W. 1
ch. which faces W.
- Soil, rocky of granite formation in form of sliderock,
ledges and bedrock, with some shallow mountain loam;
4th rate.
- Timber, few scattered limber pine.
- Undergrowth, scattered sagebrush and grass.
- Fair to poor grazing along and to N. of line; good
grazing S. of line on greater portions.

SURVEY OF PORTION OF WEST BOUNDARY OF
T. 32 N., R. 58 E.

As high cliffs make it impracticable to establish the
corners of secs. 19 and 30, and $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec.
30, on W. bdy. of T. 32 N., R. 58 E. at their true
positions, therefore I commence at a point North,
3.12 chs. dist. from the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and
36, or South 40.00 chs. from true point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.
cor. of sec. 30, and at this point,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. dia., 10 ins. in
the ground to bedrock, and supported by a large mound
of stone, for cor. of secs. 30 and 31, on W. bdy. of
T. 32 N., R. 58 E., with brass cap marked
