

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF T. 13 N., R. 71 E.

This fractional township, which borders on the Utah-Nevada state boundary, is all valley land, ranging from slightly rolling to nearly level. Sections 18, 19, 30 and 31 have a gentle northerly to northeasterly exposure and drainage, while sections 6 and 7 have a gentle easterly exposure and drainage. The main drainage is the dry channel of Baker Creek, draining easterly through the north half of section 7.

The land is covered with a medium dense growth of shadscale, greasewood, and sagebrush, with some white sage in the southern portion. There is no timber on this township, or adjacent thereto.

The soil ranges from a dry, firm gravelly and sandy clay to fine clay loam, 1st and 2nd rates. All of the township is adaptable for farming with the aid of irrigation, but is used for grazing of sheep.

Sylvester Tweedy is the only settler in this township, is located in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 7. Improvements consist of a good log house, 24x24 ft., approximately 10 acres under cultivation, 40 acres under fence, small corrals, and a shallow well for watering stock. Water is too alkaline for drinking.

The main highway between Baker, Nev. and Garrison, Utah, extends through the southern portion of sec. 31. There are several other unimproved roads through the township.

Baker, Nevada is located approximately 4 miles to the west of this township.

No indications of mineral, coal, oil or oil shale were noted within this township.

No magnetic declination taken on account of defective needle.
