GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The extreme western and north western portions of the township are mountainous; the central and eastern portions are low rolling hills and bench lands with a general easterly slope and drainage. The mountainous lands are rocky and rugged; the bench lands in the south central part are rocky and gravelly; the extreme eastern and southeastern portions are of an alkaline clay formation with little or no surface rock. This portion is underlaid with a hard-pan at a depth of six to eighteen inches.

There is very good grazing over the entire township, but particularly on the rolling and rough mountainous slopes. Sagebrush predominates over the entire area; yellow top and rabbit brush is to be found on the lower slopes, while, with the forgoing undergrowth, service berry and buckbrush are found on the mountainous slopes. Horse or Garden Creek flows diagonally through section 36. This stream is 10 to 20 lks. wide and 3 to 6 inches
