Chains

Thence to 00.00 chs. West, along the S. bdy. of T.19 S., R.57 E., making searches at intervals of 40.00 chs. for quarter-section and section corners, but none can be found;

471.04 Fall 11.30 chs. N. of the temp. cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 S., Rs. 56 and 57 E. heretofore described.

Continue West, with continuous measurement along S. bdy. of T.19 S., R.56 E. making searches at intervals of 40.00 chs. for quarter-section and section corners, but none can be found; at

942.64 Fall 2.50 chs. S. of the reestablished cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 S., Rs. 55 and 56 E. on the Ruby Valley Guide Meridian, which is an iron post, 3 ins. in dia., firmly set in the ground and mound of stone, with brass cap marked.

A juniper, 20 ins. diam., bears N.10°E., 107 lks. dist., marked T 19 S R 56 E S 31 B T

A pinon, 10 ins. diam., bears S.60½°E., 86 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 56 E S 6 B T

A mahogany, 11 ins. diam., bears S.78½°W., 34 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 55 E S 1 B T

A mahogany, 8 ins. diam., bears N.87°45'W., 41 lks. dist., marked T 19 S R 55 E S 36 B T.

The original ¼ sec. cor. bet. secs. 2 and 35 on the N. bdy. of T.19 S., R.56 E. is a pine post, 4 ins. square, firmly set in a mound of stone, 12 ins. extending above the mound, marked ¼ S on N. face;
