I restore the cor. of Tps. 18 and 19 S., Rs. 56 and 57 E., by cardinal offsets under control of the standard cor. of T.20 S.,Rs. 56 and 57 E., the cor. of secs. 13,18,19, and 24 on the E. bdy. of T.18 S., R.56 E., the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 2 and 35 on the N. bdy. of T.19 S.,R.56 E., and the cor. of secs. 4,5,32, and 33 on the N. bdy. of T.19 S.,R.57 E., at a point 1.84 chs. south and 10.155 chs. east of the temp. cor. of Tps. 18 and 19 S.,Rs. 56 and 57 E. as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 30 ins. in the ground and surrounded by a small mound of stone for cor. of Tps. 18 and 19 S., Rs. 56 and 57 E., with brass cap marked
