Timber and Stone Entry, No. 787, application dated January 10, 1906, Charles Cameron, entryman; embracing the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and W $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , lot 2 of sec. 2, 159.72 acres.
