Tract 56

Public land, embracing the $SE\frac{1}{4}NE\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 1 of the original survey, 40 acres. This parcel of land is entirely surrounded by private claims, and for the purpose of affording a better basis of description and disposal, is assigned a tract number and monumented as such.

Control for the location of this tract is taken from portions of the N., S., and E. bdrs. of tract 37, and from the reestablished E. bdy. of the township. These portions entirely surround the tract and mark the limits of its bdrs.

Beginning at the NE. cor. of the claim, which is the N. 1/16th cor. of secs. 1 and 6, and is also angle point 1/56 and 10/37, heretofore described.
