

METES AND BOUNDS SURVEY OF PRIVATE CLAIMS IN T. 19 S., R. 56 E.

Chains

Tract 48

Timber and Stone entry, No. 789, Thomas Smirl, entryman, application dated Jan. 11, 1906, embracing the $W\frac{1}{2}NW\frac{1}{4}$ and $W\frac{1}{2}SW\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 12, 160 acres.

Control for the location of this tract is taken from the E. bdy. of tracts 46 and 47, which are identical with the W. bdy. of this tract, from the N. bdy. of tract 46, which is projected E. 20 chs. to the NE. cor. and from the S. bdy. of tract 47, which is projected E. 20 chs. to the SE. cor.

Beginning at the NE. cor. of the claim,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. in the ground, and in mound of stone to top, for angle point 1/48, and 2/58, with brass cap mkd.
