80.00 Angle point 1/48 and 2/58, the place of beginning.

TRACT 49

Timber and Stone Entry, No. 783, George L. Hulet, entryman, application dated Jan. 9, 1906, embracing the NW 1/4 of sec. 14, 160.00 acres.

Control for the location of this entry is taken from the S. bdy. of tract 45, which is identical with the N. bdy. of this tract. The E. and W. bdrs. are established at cardinal courses and record distances, and the S. bdy. in harmony with the N. bdy.
