Land, rolling sandy bench; general E. exposure.

Soil, deep, loose, coarse sand; 3rd. rate.

No timber.

Undergrowth, greasewood, shadscale, sand-grass and weeds.

S.89°59'E., along S. bdy. of sec. 35.

Over gently rolling sandy bench near S. end of large clay flat, through greasewood undergrowth.

40.03 The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. as reestablished by J.B. Menardi U.S. Deputy Surveyor in 1905, which is a volcanic stone, 10x8x8 ins. above ground, firmly set, and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ SC S35 on N. face, alongside of which is the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. as reestablished by Harris and Nelson, U.S. Surveyors in 1915, an iron post, 1 in. in dia., firmly set, and marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

I re-dig the pits E. and W. of post.

60.25 Old road, bears NE. and SW.

68.27 The closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, T.20 N., R.25 E., which is a basalt stone, 16x16x8 ins., lying on the ground, and marked CC on one face.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 28 ins. in the ground with the original cor. monument standing alongside and with a large deposit of glass around post about 6 ins. under surface of ground for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, with brass cap marked

80.12 The standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36 as reestablished by J.B. Menardi, U.S. Deputy Surveyor in 1905, which is a volcanic stone, 18x12x8 ins. above ground, firmly set, and marked SC on N. face and 1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edge; alongside this cor. is the original sec. cor. established by W. Epler, U.S. Deputy Surveyor in 1868, a greatly decayed cottonwood stake with marks nearly obliterated; also, the sec. cor. as reestablished by Harris and Nelson, U.S. Surveyors in 1915, an iron post, 3 ins. in dia., firmly set, and marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, nearly level bench and clay flat with small sand hummocks.

Soil, deep, loose, coarse sand and clay; 3rd. and 4th. rate.
