	S.89°58'E., along S. bdy. of sec. 36. Over nearly level land broken by sand hummocks and hills, through greasewood undergrowth.										
16.70	Old road, bears N.80°W. and S.80°E.										
22.00	Old road, bears NW. and SE.										
26.20	Recross road, bears NE. and SW.										
27.20	Leave sand-hills and hummocks, enter alkali flat, bears NW. and SE.										
40.01	The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. as reestablished by J.B. Menardi U.S. Deputy Surveyor in 1905, which is tufa rock, 12x12x8 ins. above ground, firmly set, and marked SC $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, alongside of which is the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. as reestablished by Harris and Nelson, U.S. Surveyors in 1915; an iron post, 1 in. in dia., firmly set, and marked and witnessed as described in the official record.  I re-dig the pits E. and W. of post.  Thence  N.89°51'E., with continuous measurement.

68.45	The closing cor. of T.20 N., Rs. 25 and 26 E. which is a volcanic stone, 10x14x8 ins. above ground, firmly set, and marked with 1 notch on W. edge, other marks worn off of stone on account of the mineral condition of the soil.  At cor. point,  Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 28 ins. in the ground with the original cor. monument and a large deposit of glass buried alongside for the closing cor. of T.20 N., Rs. 25 and 26 E., with brass cap marked
