NOTE

In 1917, Philip S. Cowgill, Instrumentman, U.S.R.S., under departmental orders, executed a dependent resurvey of a portion of the east boundary and all of secs. 7,8, 17,18,19,20,21,22,23, and 24, T.20 N.,R.25 E.,M.D.M., and, in addition thereto purported to have established metes-and-bounds surveys of farm units in secs. 18,19, 20,21,22,23, and 24, each unit being designated by tract number. All section corners, quarter-section corners and angle corners of the tract surveys are reported as having been monumented with regulation reclamation service iron survey posts, the brass caps of which are rimmed as follows:

Fractically all of the section corners of this survey were found, identified, and their positions noted with reference to corners and lines of the present resurvey, only I quarter-section cor., and not a single tract cor. could be found, and it is evident from the old and well established fence lines in the area covered by the metes-and-bounds survey, that his surveys followed these lines in general but were not monumented.

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Not any of the corners of this 1917 survey were used as points of control in the present resurvey.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

A considerable variety of land is found in T.20 N., R. 25 E. The general elevation of the township is 4000 to 4200 ft. above sea level; the highest part in the mountainous portion is about 500 ft. higher. All of sections 31 to 36 inclusive and the south portions of secs.25 to 36 inclusive are mountainous with a general N. exposure and drainage. From the foot of these mountains, the lands slope gently to the north to level bottom lands or the drainage area of the township.
