Deposit a stone, 7"x 5"x 3" marked with a cross (X) at the base of the post.

Three strand barbed wire fence, bears NW and SE, enter cultivated field.

Intersect the range line between ranges 21 and 22 East at a point 12.15 chains N 5°59' E of the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of section 19, T 41 N, R 22 E, hereinafter described, and at the point of intersection:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 2 ins. in diameter, 30 ins. in the ground for the closing corner of sections 24 and 25, with brass cap marked:

Deposit about a quart of broken glass at the base of the post.

Land, gently rolling hills, general NE exposure and drainage.

Soil, gravelly clay in the west, deep clay loam in the east, 2nd and 3rd rates.

Timber, none.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, shade oak and yellow top.

Fair grazing.

From the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26.

North, on a sectional guide meridian, between sections 23 and 24.

Over rolling hills, through a scant undergrowth of sagebrush, descend 10 ft. along a NW slope.

Draw, drains NE, ascend 155 ft. along a SE slope.

Spur, projects E, descend 55 ft. over a rocky N slope.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 1 in. in diameter, 17 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner, with brass cap marked:
