

METES AND BOUNDS SURVEY OF PRIVATE CLAIMS, T.41 N., R.21 E.

Chains

State Selection embracing the $NW\frac{1}{4}NE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.10 and the $SW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.11, approved List 24.

These subdivisions are located in their approximate record position with reference to the cor. of sec. 2,3,34 and 35 on the N. bdy. of the Tp. and conform to the lines of the resurvey by new descriptions, embracing the following legal subdivisions, $NE\frac{1}{4}NW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.11 and $SE\frac{1}{4}SW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.12.

State Selection embracing the $E\frac{1}{2}SW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.9, $SE\frac{1}{4}NW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.16, $N\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.13, $SE\frac{1}{4}SW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.21, $SE\frac{1}{4}SW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.23, $SW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.23, $N\frac{1}{2}NW\frac{1}{4}$ and $S\frac{1}{2}NE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.25, $NE\frac{1}{4}NE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.26, $SW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.28, and $NE\frac{1}{4}NE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.33, approved list 8.

With the exception of the $N\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.13, these subdivisions are located in their approximate record position with reference to the original cor. of secs. 25,30,31, and 36 on the east boundary of the township, and conform to the lines of the independent resurvey under their original descriptions.

The $N\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.13 has been located with reference to the cor. of secs. 2,3,34, and 35 on the N. bdy. of the Tp., and in the absence of any culture or physical evidence of its position, has been adjusted to conform to Lots 1 and 2, Sec.18, T.41 N., R.22 E.

The east boundary of State selection embracing the $S\frac{1}{2}NE\frac{1}{4}$ Sec.25, has also been adjusted to agree with the reestablished east boundary of the township in order to avoid new designations for the lands included in the selection.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Lands in this township vary from very rough mountains in the central portion to nearly level valley lands in the extreme southwest and northwest corners.

The eastern portion contains many long draws heading in the central portion of the township. Narrow bottom lands in some of these draws have been cultivated for a number of years and indications are that good forage crops can be produced during seasons of ample water supply.

The slopes in general are steep and covered with many rocks of volcanic origin. The high mesa or ridge lands in the extreme northeast portion are very rocky. The main ridge or divide of drainage extends in a northerly and southerly direction through the central portion of the township

The soil varies from a deep heavy clay loam in the bottoms of the draws in the eastern part, to a fine wind-blown sandy loam in the extreme western part. The soil on the mountain slopes is very shallow and of a heavy clay loam. The tops of the rolling mesas and high ridges are almost entirely rock. The soil in general, throughout
