The original cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on S. bdy. of Tp. is a granite stone, 8x8x8 ins., above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with the original stone deposited at the base, for the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, with brass cap mkd.
