

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY WEST BOUNDARY OF T.22 S., R.65 E.

Chains

near ... 64 and 65 E., hereinafter described.

The bearing of this half mile therefore is  $N.1^{\circ}00'W.$ ,

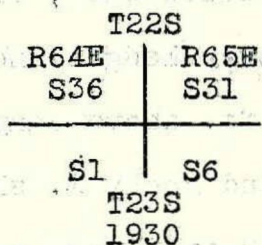
and the distance is 40.46 chs.

## True lines.

The original cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 S., Rs. 64 and 65 E., is a grayish basalt stone, 20x12x8 ins., firmly set in an old deeply embedded mound of stone; no marks are discernible on the cor. monument but the mound appears to be of the same general construction and age as mounds found at other identified cors. of the original survey.

In center of the old mound of stone,

Set and iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., over a cross (+) cut in solid rock 4 ins. under the surface of ground, and in a large mound of stone for the cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 S., Rs. 64 and 65 E., with brass cap marked



Thence

$N.1^{\circ}12'E.$ , bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Descend steep N. slope over rough, broken and rocky mountainous land through scattered undergrowth.

3.55 Canyon, 45 ft. below Tp. cor., drains E. about 10 chs., then NE.; ascend abruptly over S. slope.

7.80 Spur, 100 ft. above canyon, projects E.; descend broken N. slope over ledges and boulders.

23.75 Canyon, 470 ft. below spur, drains E. about 5 chs., then northeasterly; ascend abruptly.

30.25 Spur, 175 ft. above canyon, projects E. about 10 chs. dist.; descend abruptly over ledges and boulders.
