Chains

MEANDERS OF THE RIGHT BANK OF THE COLORADO
RIVER, UP STREAM

From the true point for the meander cor. sec. 32 on the S. bdy. of the Tp.; which is .95 chs. West of the witness cor. to said meander cor., heretofore described.

Thence with meanders in sec. 32

Along rocky bank through scattered undergrowth. Vertical rims parallel river from 40 to 60 lks. to the left of the meander line .

N.29°00'W., 1.80 chs. End of course on rocky point 15 ft. above water line.

N. 5°45'W., 2.70 chs.

N. 5°00'W., 11.40 chs. Along sandy alluvial bank; scattered box elder trees and mesquite brush. At 9.40 chs., draw enters river from the W.; leave sandy bank and continue over barren rock ledges.

N.17°00'W., 5.10 chs.

N.16°00'E., 4.00 chs.

N.10°15'W., 8.40 chs.

N.16°15'W., 3.70 chs.

N.54°00'W., 3.20 chs. At end of course the U.S.R.S. Bench Mark No.11, marked 657.08 bears S.62°54'W., 34 lks.dist.

N.14°15'W., 5.10 chs. At .77 chs., center of mouth of box canyon from the W.

N. 5°30'E., 3.40 chs. At .10 chs., stream 1 lk. wide, 1 in. deep, from a hot spring enters river. Head of spring bears N.50°W., 84 lks.distant.

N.24°00'W., 9.00 chs.

N. 2°15'E., 7.60 chs. At 4.30 chs., center of mouth of canyon from the W. Trail leads up canyon.

N. 9°15'W., 18.03 chs. To meander cor. of secs. 29 and 32.

Land, broken.

Soil, rocky and sandy alluvial; 1st. to 4th. rates.

Timber, a few box elder.

Undergrowth, scattered mesquite.
