Independent resurvey superseding the survey executed by W. H. Woods, U. S. Deputy Surveyor in 1881.

I commence the subdivisional resurvey at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36 on the S. bdy. of the township, which is an iron post, mkd. and witnessed as described in Book "B" of this group

Thence

N. 0°01' W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over gradual N. slope; through scattering undergrowth.

6.70 Shallow wash, drains N. 10° W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

51.90 Broad shallow wash, drains N. 10° W.; asc. over a SW. slope.

60.17 Intersect line 3-4 of Tract 45, at a point 18.27 chs. West of angle point 4/45, hereinafter described.

77.60 U. S. Highway No. 91, bears S. 58°12' W. and N. 58°12' E.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 30 ins. in the ground in a concrete form 6 ins. diam., for cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36, with brass cap mkd.
