State Selection List No. 8, approved February 8, 1890, embracing the $S\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$ and the $S\frac{1}{2}SW\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 24; sec. 25; the $SE\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 23; the $NE\frac{1}{4}NE\frac{1}{4}$, $S\frac{1}{2}NE\frac{1}{4}$, $NW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$, and the $S\frac{1}{2}SE\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 26, 1080 acres.

Control for the location of this entry is taken from existing original property cors., mutually accepted by adjoining landholders, and testified to as having been established by private surveys shortly after the original public land surveys in this locality. One such cor., located on the E. bdy. of the tract, together with an accepted property line along a portion of this tract, define the E. bdy. A point identified and agreed upon by adjacent property holders as being the point for the cor. of original secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36, furnishes latitudinal control for the S. bdy., its length being
