TRACT 41

After the survey of tracts 37 to 45 inclusive, it was found that the land originally designated as Tract No. 41 could be made conformable and still protect the claimants interests. Preliminary angle point positions were therefore, not monumented on this tract, but as many adjoining tracts had been monumented, the tract numbers were not changed.

TRACT 42

State Selection, List No. 14, approved July 22, 1895, embracing the S $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$; NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$; N $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 34, 200 acres.

Control for the location of this entry is taken from a point identified and accepted by local landholders as the point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of original secs. 34 and 35. This cor. fixes the longitudinal position of the E. bdy. of the claim. The length of the N. portion of the E. bdy. is controlled by reference to an accepted subdivision-of-section cor. one half mile E. of the NE. cor. of the tract. The balance of the boundaries are established at courses and distances in harmony to this control. The N. bdys. are in harmony with property lines mkd. by fence and tree lines.

At the NE. cor. of the claim, on line 3-4 tract 43 and identical with 2/44.
