

Retracement and Partial Resurvey of Mineral Survey No. 1921, Cressstone Lode,
in Section 31, Township 24 South, Range 58 East.

Note:

I was guided to Corner Nos. 3 and 4 of the Cressstone Lode and Cor. No. 5 of the Akron Lode, identical with Cor. No. 3 of the Akron Fraction Lode, by Mr. C. A. Beck, the owner of adjoining patented claims and a resident of this vicinity for a number of years.

All corners of Survey No. 1921, Cressstone Lode, shown above are known to have been in place for many years, and the general appearance of the markings on the corner posts and the general condition of the stone mounds supporting the posts bears out this assertion.

Retracements and diligent search in the vicinity of the recorded position for Survey No. 1921, Cressstone Lode, in section 30, T. 25 S., R. 58 E., failed to reveal any evidence of the claim in its recorded position, which is unquestionably erroneous. (See field notes entitled "Retracement and Partial Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the W. Bdy. and of the Subdivision of T. 25 S., R. 58 E., Incidental to Investigation and Determination of the Actual Ground Location of Mineral Survey No. 1921, Cressstone Lode, in the Yellow Pine Mining District, Nevada.)

The foregoing retracements and resurveys in T. 24 S., R. 58 E., taken in conjunction with similar retracements and resurveys in T. 25 S., R. 58 E., definitely fix the location of Mineral Survey No. 1921, Cressstone Lode, in section 31, T. 24 S., R. 58 E.

The true locations of several other mining claims in section 31 are also divulged by the foregoing retracements and resurveys. The following mineral claims are not shown in their correct positions with respect to section lines on the mineral survey plats or on the district mining sheets:

Mineral Survey No. 4690, Akron Lode, is shown in the records as situated partly in section 31 and part in section 32, when it is actually entirely situated in section 31.

Mineral Survey No. 4740, Akron Fraction Lode, also shown in the records as situated partly in section 31 and partly in section 32 is actually entirely situated in section 31.

Mineral Survey No. 4687, Bill Nye Lode, and Bill Nye No. 3 Lode are each actually situated approximately 38.00 chains further west in section 31 than shown in the official records.

General Description

Most of the area covered by this survey is rough and broken and lies largely on the northeast, north, and northwest slopes of Table Mountain. Elevations vary from about 3700 feet to 5100 feet. The area is devoid of timber and undergrowth is low and sparse.

There are a number of mineral claims, many of which are patented, scattered over the area and mining work is still active in the area. The town of Goodsprings, Nevada, is situated in the east half of section 26 of this township.
