

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF PORTION OF UTAH-NEVADA STATE LINE.

Chains

61.97 The standard closing cor. of T. 30 S., R. 20 W., Salt Lake Meridian, which is a 3 in. iron post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

64.85 Ravine, drains N. 60° E. Asc.

79.35 The 220th mile post, which is a 3 in. iron post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, mountainous to rough mountainous. Soil, rocky loam with occasional rock outcroppings. Timber, pinon, juniper. Undergrowth, black sagebrush, service berry, yellow top, native grasses. General drainage, E. Grazing, fair.

NORTH BOUNDARY T. 3 N., R. 71 E.

Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 3 and 4 N., Rs. 70 and 71 E., which was set in conjunction with the survey of T. 3 N., R. 70 E., and is described in Book "A" of field notes under this group.

East, with the establishment of the N. bdy. of the township, bet. secs. 6 and 31, on a transit line describing the secant, which starts from a point 4 lks. S. of the Tp. cor., and bears N. 89° 58' E.

Over rough mountainous land through medium heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.

Asc. SW. slope over red granite outcroppings 55 ft.

5.00 Point of red granite spur from NE.

Desc. red rocky SE. slope 10 ft.

7.00 Asc. along red rocky SW. slope 5 ft.

10.20 Bottom of canyon, head of small seepage of water, course SW.

Asc. along canyon 30 ft.

14.10 Point of spur from E.

Asc. along top of spur over red granite outcroppings 140 ft.

23.30 Asc. along broken rocky N. slope of spur 155 ft.

38.60 Asc. steep broken rocky slope 520 ft. to 61.60 chs.

40.00 N. 2 lks. from the secant, on steep rocky W. slope

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 7 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, for the 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
