

South Boundary of T 8 N, R 47 E.

Chains

Beginning at the southeast corner of T 8 N, R 47 E, heretofore described, thence:

West, on true line, along the south boundary of section 36.

Over rolling hills, through a dense undergrowth of sagebrush, ascend 75 ft. over a rolling E slope to the $\frac{3}{4}$ section corner.

16.20 Wash, 4 links wide and 3 ft. deep, drains N. 70° E.

39.45 Dim road, bears N and S.

40.00 On a gentle E slope:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 1 in. in diameter, 27 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{3}{4}$ section corner of section 36 only, with brass cap marked:

S36

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base and 2 ft. high, north of the post.

Continue ascend over an E slope.

63.90 Base of mountains, bears N and S, ascend 135 ft. over a broken E slope.

70.60 Rocky spur, projects N, descend 45 ft. along a NW slope.

73.20 Draw, drains NE, heads about 5 chains S, ascend 50 ft. along a NE slope.

77.80 Spur, projects S, descend 25 ft. along a SW slope.

80.00 On a W slope:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long and 2 ins. in diameter, 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, for the corner of sections 35 and 36 only, with brass cap marked:

S35 | S36

whence

A juniper, 7 ins. in diameter, marked T8NR47ES36BT, bears N 30°15' E, 207 links distant.

A juniper, 9 ins. in diameter, marked T8NR47ES35BT, bears N 65°00' W, 39 links distant.

Land: Rolling hills, becoming more rugged in the west; general E and NE exposure and drainage.

Soil: Gravelly to rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber: Dwarf juniper and pinon.

Undergrowth: Sagebrush and buckbrush. Native grass.

Good grazing.
