

489.95 Intersect the Sixth Standard Parallel South, West, 13.35 chs. distant from the reestablished standard cor. of T.24 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E., set by me and described in book "A", this group.

The cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 S., Rs. 61 and 62 E. is a basalt stone, 8x8x4 ins. above ground, firmly set in the center of an old deeply embedded mound of stone, and marked with 6 notches on N., S., E., and W. faces.
