Chains

INDEPENDENT RESURVEY, SUPERSEDING SURVEYS
EXECUTED BY T. A. MAGEE, U.S. DEPUTY
SURVEYOR IN 1883.

From the cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 S., Rs. 64 and 65 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins. in dia., firmly set, and marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

South, bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Descend over rough mountainous land through creosote and chaparral undergrowth.

- 3.10 Swale, 45 ft. below Tp. cor., drains E.; ascend abruptly.
 - 7.85 Point of ridge, 155 ft. above swale, bears N.60°W. and S.45°W.; descend over SE. slope 180 ft. to
 - 14.35 Draw, heads about 4 chs. W., and drains E.; ascend.
 - 17.70 Small spur, 25 ft. above draw, projects NE. about 7 chs. distant to end; descend 30 ft. to
 - 24.55 Head of draw, drains NE.; gradually ascend.
 - 25.60 Same ridge as noted at 7.85 chs., bears N.70°W. and SE.; thence along W. slope.
 - 33.35 Spur, projects SW.; descend.
 - 36.50 Draw, near head, 35 ft. below spur, drains SW.; gradually ascend.
 - 37.45 Spur, projects SW.; descend 30 ft. to
 - 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 6 ins. in the ground over a cross (+) 6 ins. in dia. cut in bedrock and supported by a large mound of stone for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap marked

- Descend 70 ft. to
 - 42.80 Draw, heads about 4 chs. NE. and drains S.; thence in draw.
 - 53.20 Rocky outcropping on line.
 - 56.55 Leave draw, drains SW.; ascend along rocky W. slope.
 - 61.00 Rocky ridge, same as noted at 25.60 chs., bears N.20°E. and S.20°W.; thence along E. slope near top of ridge.
 - 66.90 Same ridge, bears N.10°W. and S.10°E.; descend abruptly over SW. slope 175 ft. to
 - 73.25 Draw, heads about 4 chs. NE. and drains SW.; ascend 140 ft. to
 - 79.20 Rocky point, projects W. about 3 chs. distant to end at perpendicular ledge; thence along W. slope.
