

DEPENDENT RESURVEY WEST BOUNDARY OF T.7 N., R.30 E.

Chains

Undergrowth, sagebrush, bitter brush, Brigham tea, weeds and sand grass. Dense willows along bottom of Cory Canyon.

N.0°55'W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Ascend abruptly S. slope over rough mountainous land through very scattered cedar and pinon timber and short undergrowth. Surface is a coarse, deep, loose sand.

16.40 Spur, 420 ft. above sec. cor., projects S.60°E.; gradually descend along general E. slope of high mountain entering a medium growth of timber.

39.99 Proportionate point on steep E. slope of mountain, the surface of which is a loose, coarse sand of granite formation, 255 ft. below spur.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 28 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap marked
