Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam, shallow on limestone base near surface; much loose rock on surface; 3rd rate.

Timber, pinon pine, juniper and mahogany; undergrowth, sagebrush and a fair growth of grass.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The second standard parallel north, through ranges 47 and 48 east from the cor. of secs. 31 and 32 T. 11 N., R. 47 E. eastward crosses Monitor Range nearly from the floor of Monitor valley to the floor of Fish Lake valley. The land is rough broken mountains, and rises from an elevation of 6500 ft. to nearly 10,000 ft. to the summit thence descends over a steep easterly slope to about 6500 ft. The soil is generally a light sandy clay loam, mixed with decomposed limestone and shallow on a limestone base near the surface. The tops of the spurs and ridges are mostly covered with loose rocks. The drainage in range 47 E. is toward the South Fork of Mosquito Creek. A portion of the drainage in range 48 E. on the west side of the divide is toward Barley Creek southward. East of the divide and near the parallel the drainage is toward Greenmonster Creek. The area crossed is generally covered with a scattering growth of pinon pine, juniper and many small groves of aspen and mahogany. The adjacent land is used during the summer season for grazing.
