<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The east half of this township lies on long, gentle westerly and northwesterly slopes near the north end of a west branch of the Toquima range of mountains. The terrain varies from a nearly level valley floor in the central part to low rolling and broken foothills in the extreme southeastern portion.</p> <p>The soil varies from coarse rocky loam in the foothills to a fine alluvial sandy loam in the valley floor. The soil is not of great fertility as the vegetation consists principally of a stunted desert-type shadscale, greasewood and rabbit brush along with some sagebrush. There is no timber.</p> <p>Grazing is fair in the most favorable months of the early spring; at other periods, due to the lack of watering places along with the limited growth of forage plants, the area affords poor grazing.</p> <p>There is no indication of mining or of mineral deposits.</p> <p>Several unimproved dirt roads cross the surveyed area.
