## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This fractional township varies from rough, broken mountainous land in the southern portion to gentle rolling foothills in the northern part. The drainage is in a general northwesterly direction.

One small spring, situated on line between sections 35 and 36, is the only water within this fractional township. This seepage spring is small and it is doubtful if it, any period of the year, can be used for stock watering purposes. The surrounding area affords fair grazing.

There is no commercial timber in the area; pinon pine and juniper being the predominating types.

No indications of minerals or of past mining activities were noted.

The nearest settlement and postoffice is at Austin, Nevada, about 35 miles distant in a general northwesterly direction.

The magnetic declination was not recorded due to a sluggish and inaccurate needle.
