GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The boundaries of Lehman Caves National Monument were surveyed as provided for in the written special instructions and encompass an area of rolling to hilly land the greater portion of which is heavily timbered with pinon pine, juniper and, on the hilly slopes, dense thickets of mountain mahogany.

The Lehman Caves are situated in the north central portion of the reservation. The principal item of interest is the one cave which is opened to the public and in which a modern system of lighting and trail-construction was in progress at the time of the survey.

Baker, Nevada is the nearest postoffice and settlement and is about 6 miles distant in an easterly direction.
