


SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 12 N., R. 49 E.

raise a mound

of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, N. of cor.

From this cor., U. S. L. M. No. 272, which is a large boulder 1 1/2 x 2 x 3 ft. above the ground, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears N. 43° 49' E., 12.88 chs. dist.

Also from this cor., angle point No. 1, HES No. 119, which is a porphyry rock 8 x 12 x 20 ins., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears N. 36° 42' E., 13.52 chs. dist.

Asc. 80 ft. over an E. slope.

56.50 Tulle Canyon road, bears N. 20° W. and S. 20° E.; asc. 110 ft. to sec. cor.

70.20 Timber becomes dense.


79.90 The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.

Land, rolling and mountainous.  
Soil, rocky; 4th rate.  
Timber, nut pine, juniper and mahogany; undergrowth, button sage.  
Grazing, poor.

West, on true line bet. secs. 19 and 30.

Over mountainous land through dense timber and scattered undergrowth; asc. 620 ft. over a steep E. slope to 1/4 sec. cor.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.


A nut pine, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 47° W., 42 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S30 BT.

A nut pine, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 9° W., 16 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S19 BT.

Continue to asc. 420 ft. over steep SE. slope to closing cor.

62.44 Intersect E. bdy. of T. 12 N., R. 48 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 19 and 30, with brass cap mkd.
