GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This Township is mostly rough mountainous land varying in elevation from about 6000 ft. in the SE. corner to over 10,000 ft. on some of the high peaks of the Monitor Mountains which traverse the N. western part. The extreme S. eastern part of the township is rolling valley land cut and broken by numerous washes and drains heading in the mountains to the west. The lower foothills are covered by a medium dense to dense growth of juniper and nut pine, while the higher slopes are usually covered by scattered to dense growths of Curlleaf Mountain Mahogany and dense growths of quaken aspen.
