## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land in sec. 30 and secs. 31 and 32 is a gently rolling plateau, with elevation 4120 to 4150 ft. above sea level. Soil, adobe mixed with sand and clay, mostly free from rocks. A large part of sec. 30, and a part of the NE. \(\frac{1}{4}\) of sec. 31 and the NW. \(\frac{1}{4}\) of sec. 32, is now covered by water of the Humboldt Reservoir. All drainage is to the SW. toward Humboldt River. The land area is covered with a dense to scattering growth of greasewood and sagebrush and of very little value to grazing or farming. A large earth dam with connecting levee extends through sec. 30 and part of sec. 31.
