Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 9 ins. in the ground, with a granite rock 2x3x4 ins., mkd. X, deposited at the base and in a mound of stone to top, for standard cor. of secs: 35 and 36, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The entire area covered by this resurvey is one of rolling hills and mountains which is devoid of any streams or springs of water. There is sufficient vegetation to afford some grazing but only in the winter, since no water can be found during the hot and dry summer period. The region through which this standard parallel runs is typical of most of the Nevada desert country.
