## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is generally rolling hills and broken mountainous land. The soil is of very poor quality being mostly drifted sand and covered with scattered rocks deposited by erosion and glacial action. This land is covered by a scattered to medium dense growth of shadscale, button sage, mountain rush and bunch grass with a few additional types of desert plants. There is no timber in the township except a few cottonwoods and willows growing along the bank of the Walker River. The land is suitable only for grazing by a limited number of stock. There is no water in the township except in the Walker River. There is no surface evidence of mineral bearing strata.
