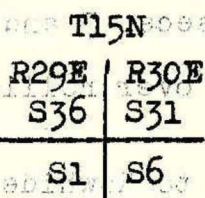


EAST BOUNDARY OF T. 14 N., R. 29 E.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY WEST BOUNDARY OF T. 14 N., R. 29 E.

REESTABLISHMENT OF THE SURVEY EXECUTED BY FRANKS AND MULLEN, U. S. DEPUTY SURVEYORS, IN 1904.

From the cor. of Tps. 13 and 14 N., Rs. 28 and 29 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

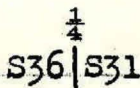
N. 0° 12' W., on true line, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Asc. 130 ft. over rolling land, through scattered undergrowth, along a broken SW. slope.

40.15 Proportionate distance, mkd. fragments of the original 1/4 cor. stake were found lying on surface of ground in the immediate vicinity of this point.

At this point,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 32 ins. in the ground, with a rock 2x2x4 ins. mkd. X, and fragments of original cor. stake, deposited at base, for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

Continue to asc. over broken SW. slope.

55.60 Low ridge, bears NE. and SW.

56.90 Begin to desc. gentle NW. slope.

63.20 Enter draw, drains SW. into highway canyon; continue to descend gradually.

74.60 Wash, course S. 80° W.

75.30 Wash, 30 lks. wide and 5 ft. deep, course S. 65° W., 1.50 chs. to junction with preceding wash.

78.60 Wash, 60 lks. wide and 3 ft. deep, course SW. 7.00 chs. to junction, thence W.

80.30 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, a badly weathered cottonwood stake 3 ins. square and 16 ins. long, found lying on a small perceptible mound of earth, which is
