GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township consists of rolling sand hills of low relief in the southwestern portion and rough broken mountainous slopes in the east central portion.

The soil varies from a fine wind blown sand to a very coarse shallow rocky loam.

The only water in the township is at a small spring situated in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 12. There are several old frame houses at this site, unoccupied at this time of survey, which is locally known as "Terrill's".

The paved highway between Schurz and Fallon, Nevada runs through the extreme western part. Fallon, Nevada is the nearest supply point and railroad station and is about 25 miles northerly.

Numerous prospect workings and several abandoned mines were noted on the steep broken N. slope of the main divide and are situated in secs. 11, 13, 14 and 24. None of these mining properties have been actively worked for many years; the type and grade of ore was not determined.

The area is suited only to limited grazing.

The magnetic declination was not recorded due to a sluggish and inaccurate needle.
