## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Lands along the south central portion of the east boundary and in the extreme southwestern portion of the township are rolling foothills; in all other portions, the lands are rocky and broken mountainous. No areas in the township may be cultivated and the only agricultural use is for limited grazing of sheep or cattle during seasons of average rainfall. The only water is situated in the  $SW_4^1$  of the  $SE_4^1SW_4^2$  of Section 4; a small seepage spring of brackish water locally known as "Cottonwood Spring."

Unimproved primitive roads make most portions of the area access-

ible to light motor trucks. .

A number of years ago some mineral activity, of an exploratory nature only, was in progress in portions of Sections 29 and 32, also in Section 13. No mineral deposits appear to have been developed.

Hawthorne, Nevada - the nearest postoffice and supply point - is about 25 miles distant in a general southerly direction from the southeast corner.

The magnetic declination was not recorded due to a sluggish and inaccurate needle.
